Course Description

Occ Ther 882 is an online 3 credit, graduate course completed during the final semester of the Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) curriculum. This course follows Occ Ther 881, a four credit, four semester series starting with the spring semester of the first year of the OTD program. Each OTD student must complete a Capstone Project as a requirement for the degree. In this non-thesis, culminating project, students demonstrate mastery of the content and competencies learned through other didactic coursework. The Capstone Project provides students with direct experience in an inter-professional collaborative activity under the guidance of a mentor committee. Development and approval of the proposal for the Capstone Project was achieved during the previous semesters under the guidance of the course instructor(s) and in collaboration with the student's Professional Mentoring Committee (PMC). In Occ Ther 882, the Capstone Project will be completed, analyzed, defended and disseminated.

RATIONALE FOR THE COURSE

Why is this course being proposed? In responding to this question, be sure to answer the following: What gap in the curriculum is this course fulfilling? What is the purpose of the course? What degree and/or major requirement(s) will this fulfill?

The proposed course is specific to the Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD) curriculum. Students in the post-professional OTD program enter with a Masters degree. The capstone project requirement was designed to be consistent with the accreditation requirements for entry level training of occupational therapists at the doctoral level. The capstone requirement is designed to encourage the integration and synthesis of content across the entire curriculum into the design and implementation of a major project applicable to a practice setting. As practitioners working in the field, students will identify a gap in knowledge or specific programmatic need in the health delivery system, gather evidence in support of the need, and develop an innovative program, intervention or approach to address the need.

Address the relationship of the course to other UW-Madison courses, including the duplication of content, both inside and outside the primary unit.

The proposed course is specific to the OTD curriculum. While other units may have similar courses (e.g. capstone courses, independent study courses) they are not specific to occupational therapy practice and, thus, would be inappropriate for this curricular requirement. Completion of a Capstone Project is an accreditation requirement of the Accreditation Council for Occupational Therapy Education (ACOTE) for doctoral level training in the profession. Occ Ther 882 follows Occ Ther 881, a 4 semester, 4 credit (1 credit per semester) Capstone I course in which students develop a capstone project idea, draft a proposal for approval by a capstone committee, and begin implementation of the project. In the current course, students complete the implementation, evaluation, interpretation of findings and dissemination of the capstone project.
